Poor propagation led to generally lower scores in 2005. Nobody (except K4TCG) beat the 100,000-point barrier; only one DX station submitted an entry; and 71 entries were submitted, vs. 75 in 2004. On the other hand, two new score records were set. K9EU handily smashed the record for out-of-state entrants. There was one close race this year; K0GSV in Missouri beat KOJPL by only two CW QSOs.
